THE BRIDGES TO LIFE VOLUNTEER CRIME VICTIM SPEAKER

BASIC DESCRIPTION:

The Bridges To Life (BTL) program is conducted inside prisons and treatment center facilities, meeting for one 2-hour session each week over the course of 14 weeks. On four occasions during each 14-week project, a Crime Victim Speaker comes to the prison or facility to tell their story before the group of program participants. A Crime Victim Speaker may tell their story at multiple prisons/facilities if desired and as needed by their Regional Coordinator.

Qualifications:

- Age 18 or older.
- Have been adversely affected by crime, whether directly as the victim of a crime, or indirectly as the loved one of a crime victim.
- Willing to tell the story of your crime victim experience and its aftereffects before a group of inmates or treatment center residents, following BTL guidelines regarding time limitations and content.
- Able to set aside personal religious or political beliefs and avoid preaching or proselytizing.
- Willing to adhere to BTL and TDCJ (or other state's) policies and procedures while inside the prison or treatment center facility.

Requirements:

- If entering Texas prisons to tell your story <u>more than four times in one year</u>, you must apply to be an approved volunteer with the Texas Department of Criminal Justice (TDCJ), *including background check*. (If outside Texas, consult that state's Department of Corrections.)
- If becoming a TDCJ-approved volunteer, you must attend TDCJ's (or other state's) Volunteer Training and complete re-certification requirement every two years (or as required in other states).
- Meet with your BTL Regional Coordinator to review your story and guidelines regarding time and content.
- Refrain from imposing personal religious beliefs, ethics, or morals on participants as part of your story or in the post-presentation Q&A's.
- Your crime victim story is a critical element of the BTL process and is presented at the beginning of the session for which you are scheduled to speak. <u>Please arrive on time at the prison or treatment facility</u>. (NOTE: Cell phones are not allowed inside prisons, so you will not be able to call or text your Regional Coordinator if you are running late.)
- Notify Project/Regional Coordinator immediately if you must cancel, and reschedule for a different date if your story is still needed for that project.

Time Commitment:

• Approximately one hour at the location, plus commuting time, for each presentation.
